Finding Joy and Peace in Disability

We all strive for joy and peace, those seemingly elusive elements of life. It's difficult, at best, to find them both under well-balanced circumstances; then we add disability into the mix, and it's a whole different situation. How does one find joy in disability? How does one find peace? Isn't it impossible to have both of these fruits of the Spirit to hold hands with disability?

When we examine where we find our joy, we understand that it's not rooted in our circumstances, feelings, emotions, or outcomes. "The joy of the Lord is your strength" (**Neh 8:10**). When obstacles

or limitations get in the way, we have a choice to see them as such or as opportunities for God's power to be revealed. I'll be the first to admit that finding or expressing joy at the center of disability isn't always easy, but if we

desire it, God will provide that joy. As a blind woman, "seeking" joy seems counterintuitive, right? How is one who is blind supposed to seek? The joy I speak of is sought with one's whole heart. Rather than seeing all the limitations or boundaries, shift the focal point to the other side of the fence.

Choose to see the unique ways God has gifted you to accomplish His work. When someone with a disability is observed praising God, it is memorable because they endure an added hurdle in daily life, allowing God's joy to be seen in a different and unique light.

What about peace? How do we find peace amid disability?

Matt 11:28 says, "Come to Me, all who are heavy laden and I will give you rest." This is the starting point of that peace. God's word also says, "My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid."

John 14:27. But what does this look like practically? What if we don't feel that peace? Honestly, disability can feel anything but peaceful sometimes. Let's be honest and tell God we don't feel the joy and peace we're supposed to.

Changing Lives Jenn Marie Brandys

When asked how she first discovered Strong Tower Radio, Jenn Marie Brandys states, "The Lord brought it to her attention; nobody told her about it directly." Using the Tune in Radio app, she discovered STR and began listening. Jenn found the content well-balanced and a blessing, even when she heard a program twice.

She later noticed an STR yard sign inside her local church lobby, but someone else took it home before she did. Jenn will soon have one of those signs and put it in her yard to invite others to listen.

Jenn was adopted into a Seventh-day Adventist (SDA) family at eight years old, where she first learned to love Jesus. She later walked away from her faith as an adult, had some rough experiences, and five years ago escaped drug addiction through recovery in Jesus Christ. There was no blazing light, no audible voice or dream. Jesus never left her and drew her back to Himself one step at a time as Jenn realized her need through the trauma of her daily life and yearned to be free!

Angels intervened to protect Jenn from an abusive ex, physically preventing him from hitting her when he tried. Realizing he was overpowered, he exited her life. Jenn recognized God's working in her life and began reaching out to Him in response. While in a court-ordered recovery program, she began attending nearby churches. God placed a Seventh-day Adventist at the recovery home where Jenn was living, and this encouraged her to return to where she first learned to love Jesus. Upon completing the program, she continued rebuilding her life, gained employment, and soon began attending her

While listening to STR recently, Jenn learned that we're to be transparent in our works to God, to "do them in such a way that God is seen, not you/me." "God's wonderful work in my life is about Him, not me. When people ask me why I'm so happy and smiling often, I tell them of God working in my life to change me and deliver me from drug addiction.

Let's talk about the elephant in the room. Disability is

hard. There are challenges that arise, sometimes daily. As I take part in the early morning hours to go and water the gardens, challenge accompanies me. I have difficulty keeping track of the green hose on the lawn.

But if I choose to focus on the beautiful warm weather, ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM I can shrink the challenge to a smaller size and glorify God and His creation to a greater magnitude. We must make a concerted effort to focus on what is joyful about our current situation, not the struggle. We must be diligent in creating space for optimal joy. This might mean planning proper time and resources to complete any task and maintaining a joyful attitude during the process. God's word tells us to be thankful "in" all circumstances, not "for" all circumstances (1 Thes 5:18).

Uneasiness can accompany disability as well. Feelings of uncertainty, anxiety, and even fear are very real emotions for those of us who live with disability. The unknown or everchanging struggles with disability can easily rob us of our peace, and searching for it in worldly offerings will only leave us empty. There are wonderful people in our lives who lend a hand when needed, granting a momentary reprieve and making us feel at peace. These are not bad ways to combat stress; however, they are only temporary. Again, we must take the necessary steps to create as peaceful an environment as possible. Making sure we don't place ourselves in stressful situations unnecessarily.

But the simplest way to obtain joy and peace in disability is to meditate on God's word, which tells us we are dearly loved, and He has His watchful eye upon us. He doesn't leave us alone to handle difficult situations, emotions, or feelings. Knowing that

God is for us brings joy and peace that cannot be duplicated in any other way. When the feelings of stress and anxiety threaten to overtake us, return to God's promise found in **Isa 43:2**, which says, "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you. When you walk through fire, you shall not be burned and the flame shall not consume you". These words can restore joy and peace in disability.
