Why Love Never Ends (Even When It Feels Like It Might)

In the Christian Standard version of the Bible. 1 Cor 13:8 reads, "Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end."

Love never ends? Why is that, I wondered. And the answer I came up with is simple—because **God is love**. In 1 John 4:8, we read, "Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love." So love never ends because God never ends. He is eternal. He had no beginning, He will have no end.

He always has been and always will be.

However, sadly, human love sometimes does come to an end. We all know someone who once stood at an altar and said "I do," only to later stand in court and say "No, I don't."

There are many reasons relationships fall apart, but I believe one primary reason is that we have an enemy determined to destroy anything and everything God values. And since God is love, the enemy targets love. God wants His children to love Him and love each other, and Satan is doing all he can to derail that.

Another reason (I believe) love fades, especially in marriage, is that many people confuse love with feelings. While feelings typically accompany love, real love goes deeper. Love is also a decision. As followers of Christ, we're not expected to like everyone. But we are called to love them with Christ like love that serves and shows grace even when it's not easy.

That includes our spouses, family members, church friends, and even those we find challenging to be around. Jesus didn't say, "Love your neighbor as long as you enjoy their company." He simply said, "Love your neighbor."

I also think we misunderstand how love grows. If you're in, or ever have been in, an intimate relationship, think back to those early days. You likely felt euphoric, counting the minutes until you'd see the other person, constantly thinking of ways to make them smile.

In 2009, my wife and I moved back to her childhood

home. Since then, I have often stepped outside at night to enjoy the expansive Michigan sky, especially in the winter. The Orion constellation, frequently in view above the hills behind our home. looked to me as if there were hidden in the placement of the stars a beautiful

message. I look at it and wonder, "Lord, what does

it mean?" As I started studying the Sanctuary, I noticed a similar pattern between the placement of the furniture and the stars in the

> Similarly, I have often pondered the logo for Strong Tower Radio, thinking, "Lord, why did you impress our board over 15 years ago to adopt that three-tiered golden tower?" Again, while studying the Sanctuary, I realized that there are three principal steps every Christian will experience:

Justification, Sanctification, and Glorification. To explain it simply, Justification happens when a person confesses and repents of their sins, giving their heart to Christ. Sanctification is the work of a lifetime as a person follows the leading of the Holy Spirit and strengthens their walk with Christ in faith. Glorification begins when Jesus returns. Just like our logo! The bottom section represents giving one's heart to God, the middle section follows the Holy Spirit's leading, and the top section is a crown, our reward after the Second Coming.

In mid-July, we put our newest station, 1110 AM – WWMN, on the air in Petoskey. As I write this article, I'm doing everything I can to build WHFJ Houghton and WUPC Iron Mountain. There are many obstacles, but I trust that the Lord will make a way for these stations to be built. The goal of STR is to uplift Christ on ALL our stations and in ALL our programming.

STR Impacts Listeners

That stage is real, but it doesn't last forever.

Research suggests that euphoric, all-consuming love tends to fade within two years. That's not bad news, it's just part of love's design. The initial thrill is meant to transition into a deeper, more grounded love, one that can endure challenges and disappointments.

If a relationship is built only on emotion, it's vulnerable. Anyone who has been married for more than a couple of years can likely admit that there have been times when they didn't feel very loving. Maybe your spouse got under your skin or hurt your feelings. But even in those moments, love can hold you steady. Love keeps you committed until those seasons pass.

Dr. Scott Stanley, professor of Marriage and Family Studies at the University of Denver and co-founder of *PREP Inc.*, describes two forms of commitment that help relationships last.

The first is **dedication commitment**, where you stay in the relationship because you *want* to. Your needs are being met, you enjoy being with the other person, and you're happy. Leaving isn't even a thought.

The second is **constraint commitment**, which is what keeps you in the relationship when things aren't going well. You may feel frustrated or discouraged, but you consider the cost of leaving, not just financially, but emotionally and spiritually. You think about the impact on your children, your extended family, your church community, and your future. Those "constraints" can help you stay the course until love and joy return.

Constraint commitment isn't fake or forced. In fact, it can be one of the most faith-filled choices we make, choosing to stay, trusting that with time and grace, healing can come.

So, how can love never end in a world where it so often does?

By keeping **God at the center** of your relationships. The more you draw near to Him, the more you're able to love others, especially when it's hard, especially when the feelings fade, especially when the only thing holding you together is a promise.

Love never ends, because God never does. And if we choose to love with *His* kind of love—faithful, forgiving, enduring then even our imperfect relationships can point to something eternal.

So, whether you're in the early gaga stage, the gritty middle, or wondering if love is still there, please don't give up.

Lean in.
Pray hard.
Stay committed.

Because love is more than a feeling—it's a decision.

A decision worth making.

A decision God made for us first.

And if you're not feeling it right now, take heart. The God whose love never ends hasn't given up on you, and He can teach you to love like He does.

officials are concerned about this species of fish because it is threatened or endangered in 19 or 20 states within its original range in the United States.




Production and Marketing

Jesus' inaugural address, the sermon on the mount recorded in Matthew 5-7, includes "Blessed are they that hunger and thirst for righteousness for they shall be filled." [Matt 5:6] A recent experience reminded me to hunger more for God's promised filling.

I was completing an oil change for a family member on their nicely paved, slightly sloped driveway. As I lay under the vehicle, tightening the oil filter, a socket I

would need next began rolling past me. A thought quickly crossed my mind, "Grab that before it rolls away." I dismissed the thought; I didn't want to move, the angle to reach it was awkward, and so on.
