When Love Grows Up

(Based on 1 Corinthians 13:11)

When the Apostle Paul wrote, "When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. But when I became a man, I gave up childish ways," he wasn't just talking about toys or tantrums. He was describing a lifelong journey, a call to maturity in how we think, speak, and love.

That verse applies beautifully to marriage, but it's really true for every relationship we have. Whether it's a spouse, friend, coworker, neighbor, or even someone at church, we all face moments when childish reactions come far more naturally than mature responses.

It happens when someone criticizes you unfairly, when a friend forgets your birthday, when your child speaks with a sharp tone, or when your spouse lashes out and you feel blindsided. In those moments, the temptation to defend, withdraw, or retaliate can be strong. But love that's grown up doesn't strike back; it slows down.

We all carry the echoes of earlier hurts. Maybe it was a harsh word from a parent, being left out at school, or a time someone we trusted let us down. Those moments leave marks, and even as adults, certain tones, looks, or words can press on those old bruises. That's why, at times, the reaction you see in someone else, or feel in yourself, seems bigger than the moment calls for. It's not really about the present conversation; it's about the past pain it brushed against.

If you're married, you've probably seen this firsthand. Maybe your husband snaps over something small, or your wife seems unusually quiet or distant. They don't mean to hurt you, but you've unknowingly stepped on an old wound. In that moment, you have a choice. You can match their tone, or you can rise above it. You can speak as a child would, or as an adult in Christ.

Marriage has a way of exposing both our strengths and immaturities. It's the closest mirror we'll ever have. Every misunderstanding, every moment of frustration, is an invitation to practice emotional and spiritual adulthood. Continued on page 4

STR Listener Impact **Continues**

Dale had a rough start. By age 8, he was drinking alcohol, by age 10 smoking, and in his teen years added drug addictions. Those markers of a broken life staved with him into adulthood until God began putting that life back together as Dale began listening to Strong Tower Radio (STR) and watching

3ABN shortly thereafter.

Dale was searching for truth prior to discovering STR. He'd been impressed that the Bible had answers that he needed, and began to read the Bible. Soon, he was searching for the original meanings of words he found in the Bible to rightly understand them. It was painstaking work. Then a breakthrough happened shortly after he purchased a new radio; the only station he could clearly pick up was STR from 93.9 FM. WAVC. Mio! The first program he heard was Ranger Bill, and one of the characters, "Old Timer", triggered a childhood memory: he'd heard this program as a kid! Drawn, he kept listening to see what would happen in the story. That was late 2020, and Dale listened to STR from then on, making STR "his station."

Dale stopped cable TV shortly thereafter and went to just listening to STR and watching 3ABN. "My life has taken a 180 degree turn since I started listening to STR."

Dale's mom had long prayed that God would take away Dale's desire for alcohol, and she witnessed God answer that prayer in early 2022, when Dale left the prison house of alcohol for good. His mom died several months later, yet was able to rejoice in Dale's Holy Spirit-powered victory. Smoking stopped in 2023, and unclean foods in early 2024. Prayer has become an increasingly vital part of Dale's life, and most recently, he stated that he's praying more than ever before. He is finding God to be a daily friend and guide. Dale states that "God has gone from a week-toweek, Sabbath to Sabbath event to an hour-by-hour companion. He's becoming more real to me, and truth is sinking in deeper."

One of Dale's latest adventures with God has been moving toward vegetarian eating since July 2025, with less meat and more plant-based foods. Another involves sharing the blessings that God continues to give him. Living alone with disabilities has often discouraged Dale, and his growing love for God is motivating him to actively bless others. "I don't want to mope around at home the rest of my days. I want to get involved," Dale says emphatically. One way he would like to help is by working with Alcoholics Anonymous to share with others how God has delivered him from the prison of addictions. Please pray for the Holy Spirit to continue guiding Dale into all truth and how to best minister to others. Continued on page 5

Mature love says, "I'll pause before I pounce." It listens first, then responds. It tries to understand what's really going on beneath the surface. Sometimes your spouse's anger is simply pain in disguise. Sometimes their silence is fear. And sometimes your own reactions are the same.



This doesn't mean excusing bad behavior or stuffing your feelings. It means recognizing that love doesn't grow by demanding change in the other person; it grows by allowing change in yourself. Paul said love "is patient and kind; it is not easily angered." That kind of love doesn't come naturally. It comes through practice, through surrender, and through choosing gentleness when pride wants the last word.

Even if you're not married, these truths still apply. We all deal with people who frustrate us or trigger something old inside. A co-worker ignores your email. A church member questions your motives. A friend disappoints you. Each time, the same question arises: Will I respond like a child or like an adult in Christ?

Childish love reacts. Grown-up love reflects. Childish love demands fairness. Grown-up love offers grace. Childish love keeps score. Grown-up love keeps perspective. Putting away childish things doesn't mean losing your sense of joy or humor. It means learning to see others through the lens of compassion instead of competition, patience instead of pride. It means letting the Spirit of Christ transform the way you handle disappointment, conflict, and pain.

When your spouse or anyone else lashes out, remember that their reaction might be rooted in an old story. You can't fix their past, but you can help redeem it by how you respond in the present. In those moments, choose gentleness. Offer understanding. Pray silently instead of reacting loudly. You might be the first person in their life to show what mature love looks like.

Those moments, handled with grace, can become sacred ground, places of healing and growth for both of you. And the more you practice, the more second nature it becomes. Marriage and relationships are God's favorite classrooms for teaching us maturity. Every day we get the chance to speak, think, and reason more like Christ and less like the child who always had to have his way.

Growing up in love is not about perfection; it's about direction. Every time you choose patience over pride, empathy over ego, you move a little closer to the heart of Christ. So the next time someone, spouse, friend, or stranger, presses one of your buttons, take a breath. Remember who you're called to be.

Though in his sixties, Dale views himself as "a youngster in the faith." His favorite STR programs are the evangelistic speakers and the Fresh Manna messages, both of which go deep into Scripture. He also enjoys the music on STR because it glorifies and praises God and encourages Dale, unlike the pop & rock music other Christian stations play. Sometimes he also likes to wind down at 11 p.m. with Night Sounds if he's still up at that hour.
